This is a task that falls upon us all on a day to day basis, irrespective of which jobsite you work on.

Local 46 stands by our members and in solidarity with racialized members to ensure everyone is safe from all forms of harassment. These are difficult times and I encourage all our members to join us in solidarity to protect members from racialized backgrounds. I am confident you will rise to this mission.
